

2024 SOAP Fundamentals September 14-21, 2024

Target Audience

This meeting is intended for Anesthesiologists, Anesthesiologists Assistants, CRNAs, Nurses, and Resident/Fellows.

Objectives

At the conclusion of this activity participants will:

- Outline the principles and pitfalls of different alternatives to provide neuraxial labor analgesia.
- Articulate the fundamental principles of urgent cesarean delivery anesthesia and multimodal pain management after cesarean delivery.
- Describe the management of common high-risk comorbidities and events in the peri-delivery period, including cardiovascular emergencies, hypertensive crises, and postpartum hemorrhage.
- Summarize the diagnosis and treatment of neurological deficits, post-dural puncture headache and other complications occurring after neuraxial analgesia/anesthesia while understanding the liability risks associated with the practice of obstetric anesthesia.
- Discuss the special considerations necessary to approach the obstetric airway and provide anesthesia for non-delivery procedures on the labor and delivery unit.
