General Anesthesia (GA)





- Some suggest rate of GA conversion for elective caesarean section (CS) should be <1% (and <5% for urgent CS)
- What is the GA conversion rate at BC Women's?

METHODS

 Retrospective chart review of all CS at BCWH in 2017

RESULTS

- Total: 2044 CS
- GA conversion rate
 (Elective CS): 1.3% (11/862)
- GA conversion rate (Urgent/emergent CS):
 2.5% (29/1151)

DISCUSSION

- 50% conversion unavoidable
- 50% may be prevented
- Is the <1% target too restrictive?

FUTURE DIRECTIONS

- More rigorous prospective study
- Better rescue protocol for failed neuraxial
- Research novel ways to identify at-risk patients
